The Rev. Dr. David VanDrunen is a minister of the gospel in the Orthodox Presbyterian Church and is the Robert B. Strimple Professor of Systematic Theology and Christian Ethics at Westminster Seminary California, where he has taught since 2001.

Dr. VanDrunen received his B.A. from Calvin College; an M.Div. from Westminster Seminary California; a Th.M. from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School; a J.D. from Northwestern University School of Law and a Ph.D. from Loyola University Chicago. He was the recipient of the Acton Institute’s Novak Award in 2004 and was a visiting fellow at the Center for the Study of Law and Religion at Emory University in the spring of 2009.

Dr. VanDrunen formerly served as a pastor of Grace OPC in Hanover Park, IL and he currently serves on the OPC’s Committee on Christian Education and the Subcommittee on Ministerial Training.

Dr. VanDrunen is the author or editor of seven books and many articles and reviews. His books include *Bioethics and the Christian Life: A Guide to Making Difficult Decisions* and *Living in God’s Two Kingdoms: A Biblical Vision for Christianity and Culture*.

He lives with his wife Katherine and their son in Escondido, California.
